INFLAMMATORY SKIN CONDITIONS

Anyone who has every owned a pet will agree inflammation of the skin is not uncommon ands is enough to cause an owner huge distress. It may be caused by allergies, flea bites, atopy, and food allergies to name but a few. A food allergy or intolerance means your pet has an allergic reaction to one of the substances in the food and usually these are either proteins or carbohydrates.

An allergic reaction is characterized by skin itching and causes from mild to intense, desperate, frantic scratching. If this scratching is severe it could lead to secondary clinical signs, such as hair loss, red, flaky skin patches, poor quality coat and chronic infections of the affected areas. Vomiting and diarrhea may also occur.

A trip to your veterinarian is essential. You may be given specific medicine as well as nutritional guidelines, which should be followed carefully. AVOID THE TEMPTATION TO FEED SNACKS AND TREATS.

If your pet does not respond as you or your vets expect contact him again in case additional medication is required.

TICKS AND FLEAS - Talking of Itching – Have you considered Ticks and Fleas. Sometimes we are quick to think of food or grass allergies BUT remember together with the hot weather comes the nasties. Both Fleas and Ticks breed at an alarming rate. Check your animals regularly and speak to your vet. There are many products on the market to assist you with combating this menace. Remember the ingestion of fleas, eggs etc also leads to worms. Deworm regularly for Fluffy's sake and yours.

KENNEL COUGH – This is not a pleasant disease for your dog or you to contend with. I am told by two vets it is doing its rounds at the moment. Remember it is highly contagious and you need to confine your animal to his home surroundings until such time as he is over it. Also restrict his activity to the minimum as any exertion causes coughing. If there are other dogs on the property there is a good chance they will catch it too.

RAISINS – DEADLY TO A DOG

LIVER CAKES

2 and a half Cups Flour/Wholewheat flour (or mixed)

2 eggs

2 teaspoons baking powder

Chop up liver in food processor and then add flour, eggs and baking powder. Pour into a Swiss Roll Pan and bake at 180 degrees for 30 minutes. Store some in the fridge and the rest in the freezer.
